ENTERING DURING THE 2022–2023 ACADEMIC YEAR: OUT OF STATE RESIDENT

Academic requirements to become an SAU Fighting Bee: a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above (on a 4.0 unweighted scale) from an accredited high school. Scholarships are determined by a combination of **unweighted** GPA and ACT/SAT score (optional). Scholarships and grants are renewable for four years of undergraduate study. Increases in scholarship awards due to change in GPA or test scores will be reviewed until **March 1**.
